New Year Spiritual Disciplines

Is there a person in your life that you have so admired that you have tried to copy their lifestyle? I don't mean copy them like a little child automatically copies their disobedient older brother or sister! Is there someone whose lifestyle choices we have tried to copy because they are successful? Is there a change in your own life that you would choose to make because of their influence on your life?

After an extended time of prayer in the wilderness and attentiveness to the Holy Spirit (Matthew 4:1-11), Jesus chose quite the variety of His disciples to follow and learn from Him. Fishermen, business owners, a rich tax collector for the Roman government, a revolutionary political zealot, a thief. Jesus took each of them, doubters, impetuous, believers (John 1:48-49) and with repeated practice, "disciplined" them to become imitators of Him in the world.

We, too, are Jesus' disciples in our world. We are each different with our jobs, capabilities, and personalities. Twenty-five times in the Gospels it says that Jesus went alone or early to pray. This means He personally chose to take time to pray. Is this a habit that we each have developed-not only a memorized prayer before we eat, but praying for our personal and extended families and communities? To help me remember I have a dated recipe card in my Bible that lists specific family prayer requests. We can use our most recent bulletin with SZ prayer requests. Do we each have a certain time that we pray? It may mean getting up earlier. Do we put it in our daily planner? Do we create boundaries that center us on God? Do we regularly make personal confession part of our day? Can we help our families develop these habits? Because of His Jewish heritage, Jesus' childhood was spent actively learning scriptures, studying the law, memorizing the Torah, and preparing to reach the age of accountability and

adulthood (Luke 2:41-53). At age 13 He would have been called up to recite a prayer, read the Torah, to be trusted as a witness and obligated to obey all the laws and commandments of God. We each need to invest time reading, studying, and meditating on God's Word both personally and corporately. Join us on Monday evenings. This helps to train our attention to focus on the Word of God as it is being read in church and to listen to the preaching about the Word. We study the Word of God to build discernment into our lives.

Another discipline Jesus started at the beginning of His ministry was fasting. He spent 40 days in the wilderness but also made it part of his routine (Matthew 6:16). He gave up time to prepare and eat food and instead spent significant time in prayer, study of the Word, and ministering. How can we build this discipline into our lives? Eating less can be both physically and spiritually healthy for us.

In addition to personal disciplines, Jesus also taught His disciples by example in corporate public worship. Jesus made it a regular practice to worship at the synagogue locally or the temple in Jerusalem (Luke 4:16). We choose to be part of a faith community that helps us to grow spiritually. We regularly confess our faith in the Apostles Creed and pray the Lord's Prayer at South Zumbro. Do we choose to make participating in church a regular weekly priority?

One of the spiritual disciplines that doesn't seem difficult for SZ is corporate fellowship. We love our gatherings and potlucks. Our Mission Coordinators have also helped us develop the outward discipline of service with serving Meals on Wheels, ServeDay, Operation Christmas Child. Our quilters meet regularly to create quilts for the homeless. We are so thankful that generosity has become a regularly repeated habit at South Zumbro.

We are called as the church to regularly practice both personally and communally these disciplines, to enrich our attentiveness to the Holy Spirit and cultivate the life and character of Jesus Christ in us, to strengthen our love for God and others. We strive to be consistent in these spiritual disciplines to bear fruit for God's Kingdom.

We are insured and required to carry up to 80% of the blanket value and that estimated value has increased due largely to inflation. Rate increase of 15%, is due to inflation and this also includes the increase in land coverage as the land transfer is complete.
