“The arrogant mock me unmercifully, but I do not turn from your law.” - Psalm 119:51

I don't think I am alone in being sick and tired of all the boxelder bugs that have invaded the south sides of our homes, businesses, barns and other buildings! They seem to “unmercifully mock me”! It is truly incredible just how many boxelder bugs there are this year. Jenny has vacuumed up more boxelder bugs in the past month than dirt from the floors! Just as you get done vacuuming you see another dozen appear out of nowhere. I've had enough conversations with people and asked “I wonder why they are so bad this year” that I decided to do a bit of research myself.

I think most of us assumed that because of the hot and dry year, perhaps this was why they seemed to be more prevalent. Well, it turns out we are all smarter than we give ourselves credit for because that is exactly what I found. Due to the hot and dry summer, the boxelder bugs thrived, therefore, seem to be much more populated this year. I wasn't surprised to read that, but I read the next paragraph from the “U of M Extension” article. It says “Boxelder bugs are nothing more than an annoyance. They don't cause meaningful damage to plants, trees or people, they don't bite people, and they don't spread disease. The worst they do is give people the heebie-jeebies, and smell a little bad when crushed.”

There are so many things in my life that are “nothing more than an annoyance”. I feel like I remove the things that give me the “heebie-jeebies” or that try to rattle me only to find that new annoyances and irritations enter in. In so many cases, the things that bother me really don't cause any damage or harm. I just wish they weren't there. They're merely an annoyance. So, how do we adapt? Do we just keep picking up the vacuum and cleaning them up? Ignore them? Verse 51 in Psalm 119 says “I do not turn from your law”. In other words, even though these annoyances are prevalent, don't lose sight of turning to God at all times and in all ways. Surely, this invasion will be short lived and the cold will come and put an end to the boxelder bug surplus eventually.

Keep vacuuming. Don't stop cleaning up the things that deride your life. In the process, you are able to glorify the Name of God as He offers opportunities for you to continue working at things in your life that discipline and shape our faith. I like what the author of Hebrews says in chapter 10, verse 36: You need to persevere so that when you have done the will of God, you will receive what he has promised. Don't give up, persevere and just keep vacuuming.

They will be contacting council members soon and ask that each prayerfully consider their willingness to be on the ballot for next year. They also plan to create a written guideline for the committee going forward which will likely suggest seeking more members for the committee. They will be sharing this with the council at an upcoming meeting.
- Grounds Committee-
 - The committee is gathering bid's for homestead demolition, as Gerhard's homestead gift to the church will be finalized soon. There will be legal fees that will need to be paid after the paperwork has been finalized. The wild flowers need to be planted soon for seed germination to happen and for the flowers to bloom in the Spring/Summer. - Church cleaning- (Michele) Service Master has given their notice and are discontinuing their services at South Zumbro, as the normal cleaner is out on medical leave. If the cleaner returns from medical leave, Service Master provided an estimate of \$468/month for cleaning fees which only cover 3 hours of cleaning per week. Recently the cleaning services have been less than satisfactory. Michele spoke with and toured the church with Ana Pulido regarding her cleaning services. Ana's rates are \$289/ week for 5 hours and she is able to clean items that will no longer need volunteers in the spring for church spring cleaning.
 - Special email information meeting completed regarding the cleaning services and Pastor Pete provided to the council after the KM Ministerial meeting that other congregations use Ana and highly recommend her. M/S/A to hire Ana as the new cleaner at South Zumbro.
- Audio/Visual Needs- (Bill)
 - Sound Media and Design have been having issues with the streaming software called Black Magic that we are currently using. Our streaming services with this software are past the warranty date. Sound Media has stopped recommending and using this streaming software due to the many issues that customers are experiencing. The quote to update to a different streaming software system to help alleviate online streaming issues is \$2,200. M/S/A

World Pneumonia Day

There is a fight going on in the world besides the conflict in Israel and the Hamas in Palestine. The fight is to reduce deaths from the single biggest infectious killer of adults and children. What is it? Pneumonia took the lives of 2.5 million adults and children in 2019 alone. The combined effects of the Covid-19 pandemic, climate change and conflict is fueling a pneumonia crisis, placing millions at risk. In 2021 the estimated number of deaths from respiratory infections (including influenza, RSV, and Covid) was a massive 6 million. November 12 is World Pneumonia Day. It is the very young and the very old who are at greatest risk. Children living in areas with declining vaccination rates, rising malnutrition due to food shortages, and in homes that use polluting fuels for cooking and heating are particularly vulnerable. Older adults exposed to air pollution - most significantly from burning fossil fuels - and smoking are also at risk.

Have you had YOUR immunizations this year? All adults 27-65 should make sure they are up to date on Covid-19 vaccine, influenza vaccine, hepatitis vaccine, MMR (measles, mumps, rubella) vaccine and Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, whooping cough) vaccine.

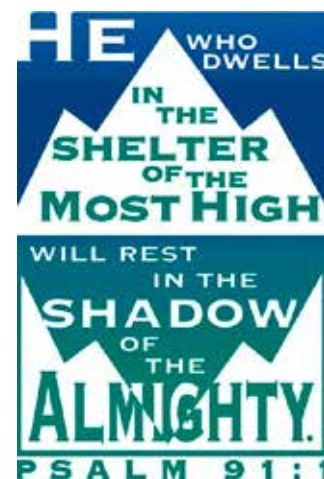
Adults need vaccinations too. Getting vaccinated is one of the safest ways for us to protect our health. Vaccines help prevent getting and spreading serious diseases that could result in poor health, missed work, medical bills, and not being able to care for our family. Besides the vaccines listed above, all adults 50-64 should also ensure getting the shingles vaccine. Adults over 60 should talk to a healthcare provider about getting a single dose of RSV (respiratory syncytial virus) vaccine. As we get older, our immune systems tend to weaken over time, putting us at risk for certain diseases. We each need the protection of vaccines that are now available.

We all need physical, emotional, and spiritual protection. Psalm 91 is a favorite Psalm, talking about protection from pestilence or disease.

“Whoever dwells in the shelter of the Most High will rest in the shadow of the Almighty. I will say of the Lord, He is my refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust. Surely he will save you from the fowler’s snare and from the deadly pestilence. He will cover you with his feathers, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness will be your shield and rampart. You will not fear the terror of night, nor the arrow that flies by day, nor the pestilence that stalks in the darkness, nor the plague that destroys at midday. A thousand may fall at your side, ten thousand at your right hand, but it will not come near you. You will only observe with your eyes and see the punishment of the wicked. If you say, “The Lord is my refuge,” and you make the Most High your dwelling, no harm will overtake you, no disaster will come near your tent. For he will command his angels concerning you to guard you in all your ways; they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone. You will tread on the lion and the cobra; you will trample the great lion and the serpent. “Because he [b] loves me,” says the Lord, “I will rescue him; I will protect him, for he acknowledges my name. He will call on me, and I will answer him; I will be with him in trouble, I will deliver him and honor him. With long life I will satisfy him and show him my salvation.” We need not fear disease when we listen to the instructions from our medical providers to the very best to do no harm and use the wisdom that God has given us. God’s promise is “with long life I will satisfy him and show him my salvation.”

What an eye opening experience The Women's Shelter brought to our Adult Sunday School and High school Sunday School classes on Sunday, October 8th! For those participating, we were all given slips of paper to represent money and read actual scenarios of what some abused women, AND men, have faced in Southeastern MN. As Jeannie T and Melissa O read the scenarios, we all had to move around the Fellowship Hall to the stations they had set up. Home, Friends Home, Hotel, Apartment, Shelter, or Homeless were our choices. Everything cost money, there were lawyer expenses to consider, there were kids at home calling you, begging you to come home, our finances were stolen by the abusive person, etc. I, Lu Clifford, was surprised that, in the end, I ended up going back home for the kids. I think it gave all of us new insight into this horrible situation, and I am adding these victims to my daily prayer list, even though I have no names, God does. As a Mission Coordinator, we started the Baby Bottle Fundraiser 2 years ago. We hand out Baby Bottles, to whomever wants one, around Mother's Day. You take the bottle home, put it in your house where you can see it everyday. You pray for these victims and their children, put money, or checks in the bottles, and bring them back to church on Father's Day. You'll see in the Thank you letter section of this newsletter, that this year South Zumbro gave \$2,030.79. Last year we gave \$1721.56. This money stays in Dodge County and is used for things like gas cards, Hy-Vee gift cards, help with legal fees, help with relocation costs and rent, clothing for them, some leave without any warning so they can't pack a suitcase. We want to thank all of you who participated in the Interactive Presentation on October 8, have given to this charity, and have prayed alongside us. We ask for your continued prayers and support for these suffering men, women and children. Psalm 82:3 says "*Defend the weak and the fatherless; uphold the cause of the poor oppressed.*" AND Galatians 2:10, "*Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ.*" Thank you, South Zumbro, for being such a giving, loving family of God.

ALSO South Zumbro is going to adopt a family this year in Dodge County through the Salvation Army! We will adopt one family. Each member of the family, including adults, are asked for the top 10 wish list items. We do not have to get all 10 items, but it gives us options for gifts. HYGIENE ITEMS: toothbrushes, combs, washcloths, etc.

OTHER: t-shirts, socks, ball caps, sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, flashlight (with extra batteries)
